This position works directly with community members to co-create an anti-hunger movement and provides a high level of personal satisfaction. REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS/SKILLS/ABILITIES

- Knowledge and/or experience working with community-based organizations (including neighborhood, religious, and civic organizations) and willingness to do outreach to community groups and leaders.
- Experience working with a wide array of individuals from diverse populations and backgrounds.
- Experience leading a team and setting direction and goals.
- Warehouse, big truck, and/or grocery store experience strongly preferred.
- Energized by interacting with people from various backgrounds and the ability to communicate with diverse communities.
- Ability to lift 40lbs throughout the shift.
- 1-2 years of food service and/or warehouse experience.
- Competency with basic computer skills.
- Bilingual Spanish, Arabic, or Mandarin speaker preferred but not mandatory.
- Ability to work up to one evening shift per week. Weekend hours may be required.
- Valid driver's license and safe driving record.

- Ability to drive safely and comfortably a 26' box truck (training provided for those without experience) for up to 50 miles a day.
- Comfort and ability to do manual labor and "dirty" work AND the ability to generate that enthusiasm with volunteers about "dirty" work tasks.
- Flexibility and ability to multi-task in a busy, service-oriented environment.
- Willingness and Enthusiasm to learn on the job.

The Metro Caring Food Access Assistant's duties include:

Market and Warehouse Operations

- Prioritize safety in all areas of the loading dock, warehouse, market, and parking lot.
- Assist with planning the daily workflow in Metro Caring's Fresh Foods Market and warehouse.
- Ensure community members have an excellent shopping experience in the Fresh Foods Market.
- Monitor stock levels and communicate shortage or surplus to the Food Access Manager.
- Support waste, composting, and recycling programs to ensure that environmental and food safety standards are being met.
- Support with partner organization donations and relations.

Volunteer Support & Direction

- Serve as primary shift lead for about 30% of volunteer shifts.
- Provide leadership through clear direction and coaching for volunteers.
- Work closely with the volunteer team to ensure volunteers have the support they need to be successful.
- Implement intentional conversations to develop volunteers using a lens of diversity, equity, and inclusion.

Community and Collaboration

- Communicate clearly with diverse groups of people including volunteers, donors, and participants.
- Articulate and model Metro Caring's values for volunteers and others in the Metro Caring community.
- De-escalate conflicts which may arise between individuals as needed.
- Build relationships with volunteers, donors, and participants.

Culture of Engagement

- Attend weekly team meetings, cross-team meetings, and monthly all-staff meetings/retreats
- Attend 50% of volunteer gatherings per week and meet and greet volunteers
